

a note from administration...

DATA families, as I mentioned in our previous communication, we had started remodeling and renovations in many classrooms with the understanding we would remain virtual for the remainder of this school year. We conducted our official walkthrough and it was agreed that we will have to delay our opening. We have been working with our contractors to meet the April 6th deadline for completion, but unfortunately due to delays in receiving materials and the unforeseen obstacles that occur with any remodeling project, we will not be able to offer in-person learning at this time. **Our new anticipated re-opening will be April 26th.**

I apologize for this delay and hope you understand that the safety of our students and staff is a priority. Currently many hallways are full of furniture, supplies and equipment that could pose a hazard to students as they navigate through the school and especially if we need to evacuate the building in an orderly and efficient manner. We will keep you updated as to our progress and should we be able to open sooner, will let you know.

Our COVID practices and procedures are in place and ready to be implemented when we return, this is truly about our current available space and safety of faculty and students.

School Re-opening: What to Expect

Here are some things you can plan for as we inch closer to returning to school in-person on Monday, April 26th:

- The class schedule will not change.
- Students will need to take their temperature at home before coming to school every morning.
- Families will need to check each student in to the Dr. Owl app before entering the school every morning. Students that have not checked in using the app will not be allowed to enter the building.
- Students will be allowed to enter the building at 8:50 am every morning.
- Students will be required to wear their mask at all times while on school grounds, with the exception of brief "mask breaks" in the outdoor courtyards and eating/drinking water.
- Social distancing will be enforced with all students and staff on school grounds.
- All classes will still be hosted virtually via Discord so that teachers and students in-person can still interact and collaborate with students that have chosen to remain virtual.
- Students that return to school in-person will need to bring:
 - a mask
 - laptop & charger
 - a water bottle
 - a lunch that does not require a refrigerator or microwave
 - a backpack with whatever school supplies they would be using at home for their classes




- Students will be dismissed at 1:50 pm every day and will need to make arrangements to leave campus by 2:00 pm.
- Wednesdays will remain asynchronous with virtual advisory meetings at 9:00 am via Discord.

School Construction Update


There has been so much talk about our school being under construction these days, so we figured we could give you a brief tour of some of the areas we're working on in preparation for our April 26th re-opening!

Our west lab is almost ready for some new ceiling tiles (bottom-right)!



We have received many requests for a celebration for seniors and would like to host a **Senior Day on Wednesday**,


Senior Day - May 12th May 12th from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at DATA. We invite seniors
