
SATURDAY MAY 14TH, 12 NOON VETERAN'S MEMORIAL AMPITHEATER

Caps and gowns will be handed out soon. We will keep you posted!







ACCUPLACER/DUAL ENROLLMENT TESTING

Ms. Reeder will be hosting sessions on select Mondays for students in grades 9-11 to apply to CNM for dual credit and for seniors to apply as college freshmen. Students in all grades will also have an opportunity to take the Accuplacer placement test at this time. Allow approximately 30 minutes for the CNM application and 60-90 minutes for the Accuplacer.

*Students need to know their social security number and permanent address (not a PO Box) in order to complete the CNM application. If you do not have a social security number, Ms. Reeder can provide alternate instructions.

**Students need to know their 9-digit CNM ID number in order to take the Accuplacer test. If you have applied before, bring your ID number!

This year we are also asking parents to help us out with chaperoning and catering. Here is a <u>link</u> to a


